Cecil's Mill Historic District featuring Cecil's Old Mill

The area known as Cecil's Mill Historic District is one of Maryland's first Industrial districts; it includes Cecil's Country Store and Post Office and Cecil's Old Mill. Inside the mill, you can see artifacts of the era, including a working water wheel, and shop for handmade arts and crafts by local artisans.



Historic St. Mary's City

Maryland's premier outdoor living history museum and archaeological park, located on the site of the state's first capital. Step on board a tall ship, discover the world of the Yaocomaco Indians and of tobacco planter Godiah Spray. Visit the reconstructed brick chapel and the St. John's Site Museum.

Located at the tip of St. Mary's County, Point Lookout served as a Civil War prison camp. It features a museum and reconstructed fort as well as a lighthouse, nature trails, a pier and other recreational amenities.



Sotterley Plantation

Sotterley is the sole surviving Tidewater plantation in Maryland that is fully accessible to the public. This architecturally unique residence features fine period woodwork. A slave cabin and more than 25 out-buildings show the Plantation's 300-year evolution.
